WHERE ARE WE?

- ◆ In our Housing programs serving more than 400 low-income elderly and disabled residents at Melville Towers, and at The Young House.
- ◆ In police cars during the Clergy and Police Ride-Along Chaplains.
- ◆ In the rooms of patients and throughout St. Luke's Hospital our Chaplains work with local churches and the Faith community to provide support to those who are in need.
- ◆ In working with the community on homelessness and other social justice issues.
- ◆ In the Representative Payee Ministry, an accounts payable ministry in partnership with the Massachusetts Department of Developmental Services. Handling the checkbooks and fiscal obligations of 175 individuals.
- ◆ In working to end violence through collaborative community ministries, in Peace Marches, gun exchanges for food and hands on ministries in the neighborhoods.
- ◆ In the ICC Council Alerts sharing information with approximately 1500 area clergy, lay and community leaders.
- ◆ In the gathering of clergy for fellowship and mutual support.
- ◆ In the churches each week.
- ◆ In the community through a variety of activities, programs and Council sponsored events.
- ◆ In our data base support.
- ◆ In collaboration with Bridges to Faith Ministry
- ◆ In public schools with mentors and our "Healthy Choices Program" to help kids make good choices resolving problems with non-violence and respect.
